# Call to submit nominations and intent to run for a position on the Board of Directors

## In memoriam: Dr. Valentín Pérez

This last year, the academic course (2023-24) at the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine at the University of León commenced differently. Dr. Valentín Pérez, Professor of Pathology, was absent after unexpectedly passing away on August 7th, leaving a big void. Dr. Pérez, born in the Basque Country, spent his early years there until he moved to Zaragoza to begin his veterinary studies, graduating with the best record in his promotion in the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine where he later obtained his Ph.D. in 1992. Afterwards, in 1995-96 he joined the University of León where he started his university teaching career and continued with his research career. He was a diplomate of the European College of Small Ruminant Health Management, and, by exam of the prestigious European College of Veterinary Pathologists, demonstrating his great value as a pathologist. Also, worth mentioning, are his international

internships at Moredun Research Institute in Edinburgh and the University of California in Davis. Dr. Pérez is known globally for his expertise in veterinary pathology and his research on infectious diseases in ruminants, working intensely on paratuberculosis pathogenesis and host immunity. He has published over 140 papers, among which include his elegant classification of histopathological lesions of paratuberculosis in domestic ruminants. Dr. Pérez was also actively involved in clinical cases at the Veterinary Hospital affiliated with the University, with diagnostic services at the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine, and was engaged with several animal pharmaceutical and veterinary companies. Valentín was very committed to university management and after holding different positions, in 2018 he was appointed Director of the Animal Health Department at the University of León. After his passing, we all have had the opportunity to read many comments on social media from people that have had the opportunity to meet and work with him, all of them emphasize his human nature, his ability and willingness to share and transmit knowledge. We underwrite all those comments but most of all we maintain that the sky is now wiser and the earth is forlorn.

Valentín, your colleagues from the IAP and the paratuberculosis research community will never forget you.

## **Update on Board Activities**
